# Partnering in hope: Updates from Belmont UMC's Outreach Committee

In an exciting new collaboration, Ebenezer will host a six-week summer school program in partnership with HOPE, an academically focused nonprofit organization. The program will run June 2 to July 11, from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. each weekday. Mornings will focus on reading and math, followed by fun, enriching activities in the afternoon. Ten children from Ebenezer families are already planning to attend, and HOPE will welcome additional children from the wider community. The program is open to students entering Kindergarten through 5th grade.

Tuition is \$150 per week, and thanks to generous contributions, six Ebenezer children already have full tuition covered. We are pleased to share that Belmont's Outreach Committee has committed to covering tuition for two additional students, helping ensure that cost is not a barrier to participation. Parents are also contributing toward tuition; HOPE has proven to be a deeply committed partner, already collaborating on resource sharing and fundraising efforts. This is a meaningful step forward in supporting educational equity in West Nashville.
