#### What if the Bible is still Good News?

Sundays, September 7 - October 12, 9:15am in Parker Hall

Throughout history and into our modern moment, the Bible has often been used to discriminate, judge, and divide. When scripture is wielded as a weapon, it can leave us wondering: Is the Bible still Good News? Can we approach it today and truly hear the voice of God - the voice of Love - speaking to us?

On Sundays, September 7-October 12, our sermon series will explore this question through different lenses for engaging our sacred text. During this time, Pastor Paul, Hunter Wade, and others will also lead a Sunday school class from 9:15am-10:15am, to help us dive even deeper into new ways of reading the Bible.

This class is for everyone, whether you've never been in a small group before or want to bring your entire Sunday school class along! Our hope is that, by asking these questions together, we can discover new ways of relating to the Bible that help us connect more deeply with God, with one another, and with the world.
