

Room in the Inn (RITI) will resume at Belmont UMC on November 7. Once again, we will welcome 12 unhoused guests on Friday nights during the colder months, providing a warm and safe place to rest.

Our hospitality includes serving a hot dinner, sharing fellowship with our guests, and providing beds, showers, breakfast, and sack lunches. Help complete the Mama Lynn Center schoolhouse



The Mama Lynn Center, a refuge for sexually abused women who have been abandoned by their villages, husbands, and children, provides a place to learn skills such as sewing, cooking, and soap-making while also helping women reconnect with what they have lost.

The center is currently building a three-room schoolhouse, which now has a roof and walls. To complete the floor, ceiling, windows, desks, tables, and chairs, \$24,000 is still needed. Because the building must be protected from tropical storms, the funds are urgently needed.
