
Even when despair is all around us and apathy seems the order of the day, we set our face steadily towards the light.

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

The celebrant invokes the present work of the Holy Spirit and then praises the Trinity, concluding:
All honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and forever.
Amen.
