HERO works tirelessly to ensure that children and youth experiencing homelessness have what they need to succeed in school.

This year, funds collected will support HERO students who are making the incredible leap from high school to college - a milestone that often comes with unexpected expenses. Your donation will support needs such as a \$350 dorm deposit at MTSU for a 17-year-old McGavock High School student who is an unaccompanied homeless youth. She has a 3.26 GPA and will begin her studies at MTSU in the fall. Your gift also helps provide Uber rides to graduation rehearsal and the December ceremony for another unaccompanied homeless youth who graduated early with a 3.22 GPA.
