Free seminar for lawyers who want to help refugees

Newly arriving refugee populations – Afghans, Haitians, and Ukrainians – are resettling in Nashville and need legal help to establish stability for themselves and their families. A free seminar on Monday, May 23, at 12:00pm will provide an overview of at-risk populations and the basics of immigration and asylum law needed to take on a case with no prior immigration or asylum experience required. At the end of training, we will provide options to match with a family or individual who has been screened for asylum eligibility and is waiting for representation. This collaborative training is co-hosted by Bass, Berry & Sims, Tennessee Justice for Our Neighbors, and the Vanderbilt Immigration Practice Clinic.
