
#### 2nd Quarter Highlights:

- Church income has exceeded expenses by almost \$16,000 through the second quarter.
- WDS income has exceeded expenses by \$54,000 through the second quarter.
- Due to expenses being under budget, we have not yet had to move any funds from our reserves this year, despite budgeting to do so.

#### **Belmont UMC 2023 Q2 Income**



Overall church expenses are at 94.5% of budget, which represents approximately \$50,000 under budget through June 30th.


